JUNIOR SHOW

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Please read all rules - no exceptions will be made.

1. All Classes are open to boys and girls, 22 years of age and under unless otherwise stated.
2. Each exhibitor must be a member of the Society. Junior Membership fees, 22 years of age and under are \$5.00.
3. Please do not lose your membership, duplicates will cost \$5.00.
4. Membership fees are not refundable. Junior Memberships allow you to exhibit in the Junior and 4-H Shows only. A Junior Membership includes one entry per day of the Fair.
5. Entry fees will not be charged.
6. All exhibits are to be delivered to the Main Exhibit Building Only at the days and times specified. Dates for entry are as follows:
Flowers and Cooking: 9 a.m. - 10 a.m. Wed. of Fair Week
Weigh Off Specials: 6 p.m. - 8 p.m. Tues. of Fair Week
All Other Exhibits: 4 p.m. - 8 p.m. Tues. of Fair Week
7. All exhibitors must complete and fasten exhibit tags to each exhibit. Failure to do so may cause loss of prize money. Tags are available from the Exhibition office.
8. All exhibits receiving a premium, unless exempted, must remain until the close of the show. Prize money will be forfeited if this rule is violated.
9. All entry forms must accompany entries with tags already on exhibits.

10. All exhibits must be the bonafide property of the exhibitor. Any person showing anything for competition not his or her own shall forfeit prize money. All exhibits must have been made since last year's Fair, and not previously exhibited at this Fair.
11. All articles are exhibited at owner's risk.
12. Exhibits not complying with this Prize List may be exhibited at the owner's risk and no prize money shall be awarded unless authorized by the Committee Chairperson.
13. If there is a shortage of space, non-prize winning exhibits may not be exhibited and the owner will be notified to pick up his or her exhibit.
14. Exhibitors will be allowed only one entry in each section; ie: Class: 1205 Section: 88JR.
15. It shall be the duty of the judges to award such premiums as they consider the exhibit entitled to. They may withhold a prize from any exhibit improperly classed or not worthy of a prize.
16. No interference will be tolerated while judging is taking place.
17. After judging the winners' tags will be opened.
18. The Prize List is subject to correction of typographical errors and/or omissions. In case of a disagreement, the ruling of the Committee Chairperson shall be final.
19. Exhibits are to be removed from the building on Sunday of Fair Week, the close of the Fair, **between 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m.** You must present your Junior membership card when picking up your exhibits. Exhibits not claimed by three days after close of the Fair, shall become property of the Society.

20. The prize money cheques will be ready the Sunday of the Fair, at the close of the Show.
21. While the Directors will take every possible precaution under the circumstances to secure the safety of the life and property at the Exhibition, the Society declares that it is strictly understood that exhibitors and others attend the Exhibition at their own risk.
22. Prize money cheques not cashed by November 20th of the current year are void.
23. All protests must be made in writing and must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal, and must be delivered to the secretary on the day of cause of protest accompanied by \$1.00, which will be forfeited to the Society should the protest not be sustained.
24. In the event of rain or inclement weather so affecting the Gate Receipts as to leave the holding of the Fair a financial loss, after the Government Rain Insurance has been taken into account, the Society reserves the right to pay all premiums, awards, or purses at a rate on the dollar sufficient to make good the loss.

3. A horse and rider must be at a suitable level of ability for safety in a group rail class before participating in a group rail class. Specifically, the horse and rider must be able to walk, trot and canter quietly in a group. Any horse that is considered unsafe or disruptive to other contestants will be excused from the ring.
4. 4-H age divisions apply.
5. 4-H Riding level system will apply.
6. Attire and Tack: All 4-H classes are open to tack but must follow the rules for English or Western equipment in riding classes per W.H.A.O. rulebook.

4-H SHOWMANSHIP ATTIRE:

WESTERN:

Traditional Western hat; long-sleeved shirt with collar; Western style jeans that are clean and pressed or Western dress pants; Western boots; belt, tie, pin or other neckwear. Jacket is recommended for Showmanship. Hair must be neat and contained.

ENGLISH:

Hunt cap, jacket, breeches with hunt boots or jodhpurs with jodhpur boots, stock tie or choker; hair must be neat and contained.

HALTER:

Preferably leather but if using nylon, it must fit properly and be “show ring clean”. Silver show halters may be used but will not affect judging.

When competing in Showmanship in English attire, a member must use a halter (not a bridle), regardless of breed, but may not use a silver show halter.

HARD HATS WITH A NARNESS ARE MANDATORY WHEN MOUNTED ANYWHERE ON THE GROUNDS. THEY ARE OPTIONAL IN SHOWMANSHIP.
